About the Journal

Introduction

e-FLT is a peer-reviewed academic journal published by the Centre for Language Studies of the National University of Singapore. Its primary objective is to disseminate scholarly information on research and development in the field of Second and Foreign Language Teaching and Learning in Asia and beyond. It publishes articles and book reviews in English as well as in any of the nine languages taught at the Centre for Language Studies, namely Chinese, French, German, Japanese, Indonesian, Malay, Tamil, Thai and Vietnamese. Its multilingual platform is a unique feature that will broaden its scope and allow it to reach out to academics. researchers, practitioners, and other professionals specializing in various languages.

It also features a conference calendar with information on upcoming academic and professional conferences, seminars or symposiums as a service to its readers.

Frequency of Publication

There are two issues of e-FLT a year, appearing in the months of June and December. e-FLT is published electronically in the Internet to allow it to reach a wider audience in Asia and the rest of the world, while keeping production costs to a minimum, making it possible to grant free access to the journal.

Call for Manuscripts

e-FLT welcomes manuscripts in English, Chinese, French, German, Japanese, Indonesian, Malay, Tamil, Thai or Vietnamese on research, development or practice in Second and Foreign Language Teaching and Learning. Manuscripts for journal articles should not be longer than 8,000 words, while book reviews should generally be between 700 and 2000 words in

length. All manuscripts are to be accompanied by brief biodata of the authors of not more than 60 words. For article submissions, an abstract in English of between 150 and 200 words is required. For articles written in a language other than English, authors will be asked to submit a summary of between 350 and 450 words in English, upon acceptance. Authors are requested to follow the instructions in the style sheets (available online) for the formatting of manuscripts.

Wherever possible, manuscripts are to be sent by e-mail as MS Word documents or in Rich Text format to <u>e-flt@nus.edu.sg</u>. Authors without e-mail access can send their manuscripts on a floppy disk or CD-ROM to the correspondence address below.
